

APPLICATION PROCEDURE FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

1. REQUESTING A USERNAME AND PIN (LOGIN CREDENTIALS)

Apply online through this website <http://www.opii.upv.es/incomings>

First, you will have to create a new profile: "Request a user ID and password". In "Type of activity" select "Student exchange program" and then select your School/Faculty of admission at UPV, in this case, "Ing. Edif. - SCHOOL OF BUILDING ENGINEERING".

Make sure that you write the correct email address that you check frequently. Your request has to be seen and processed, so do not expect to receive your login credentials immediately (it may take a few working days). **UPV staff can only approve a request for login credentials if we have previously received a valid nomination from your home university, confirming that you have been selected for a mobility period at UPV, for the field of civil engineering.**

If everything is correct, you will receive two automatic emails:

- An email with instructions to complete a full online application
- An email including your user identification number and PIN number. Save these login credentials, as you will continue to use them during your final registration and during your stay at UPV.

2. ONLINE APPLICATION ON OUR APPLICATION PORTAL (AIRE)

When you receive your login details:

STEP 1

- Go back to <http://www.opii.upv.es/incomings> or use the direct link <https://aplicat.upv.es/aire-app/>. Complete all fields of the electronic form.
- Include a pre-selection of classes to take at UPV (section "Academic data"). You will be allowed to make changes during your stay if necessary. **Before choosing your classes, read attentively the information in sections 6 and 7 of this document.**

STEP 2

- Once you have completed all sections, **confirm your application using the button Confirm application**. Do not worry, you will be able to upload documents later.
- When you have done this, the status of your application will change to "Confirmed" and a new orange button will appear on the screen: **Print application**. Click on this button and the system will open a new window with a PDF file including all your details on one page.

STEP 3

Finally, you must upload the following documents to your online application:

- **Printed application**, signed by you and your university. This is the document you obtain in Step 2. Please attach a recent picture (passport-style) in the upper right corner.
- **Letter of presentation/motivation**: freestyle, maximum 1 page in English or in Spanish.

- **Recent academic transcript (in English or Spanish):** your academic results **since your first year of university education**. If you are a master's student, include also a transcript for your bachelor studies. If the document issued by your home university does not include the courses you are enrolled in during this semester, create a Word document yourself. Merge all documents (Bachelor + Master + courses enrolled this semester) into one single PDF file.
- **Certificate(s) of Spanish language skills** (see section below "4. Language requirements").

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION (ALL DOCUMENTS MUST BE UPLOADED BY THIS DATE) (*)

- **WINTER / FALL SEMESTER or FULL ACADEMIC YEAR: 15 May**
- **SPRING SEMESTER: 15 October**

(*) You must start your online application at least one week before the deadline for two reasons:

1) we have to allow you into the system by giving you login credentials and 2) your university has to sign a document at the end of the process before you upload it.

3. LANGUAGE OF TEACHING

IMPORTANT NOTICE:

All our programs are taught in Spanish. We offer only a few courses (subjects) in English, with limited spaces, almost all of them in the February-June period. [LINK HERE](#)

Classes in English offered by other faculties of UPV are very often full and sometimes unavailable to exchange students accepted through other UPV Schools. **We cannot guarantee enrollment in classes in English offered by any other School.**

When you prepare your Learning Agreement/study program at UPV, do not assume you can be enrolled in English courses taught by any other UPV Schools, especially if you are looking for UPV courses to replace obligatory credits in your home university.

4. LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS - CERTIFICATES ACCEPTED

All Erasmus / exchange students applying for admission to our School of Building Engineering must submit proof of having achieved **level B1 of Spanish for admission (B2 for students applying for courses from the Master's degree in Building Engineering)**.

The only exceptions are:

- a. Spanish native speakers
- b. Italian or Portuguese native speakers: it is not obligatory to upload an official Spanish language certificate, but these students must sign and upload Annex I (self-certification), available at the end of these instructions and also [in this link](#).
- c. Project Work in English: students accepted by an academic from ETSIE to do a Bachelor or Master's thesis in English and who are not going to enroll in any courses taught in Spanish.

We accept the following Spanish language certificates

- [DELE B1](#), [UniCert](#) Stufe 1, [SIELE Global](#) (in person or remote version), [TELC](#) B1,
- Annex II (last page of these instructions), also available [in this link](#).

We do not accept the following documents

- Erasmus OLS test results
- Transcripts of records from secondary school. Please discuss your current level with your home university and ask them to sign [Annex II](#).
- Certificate of enrollment in a B1 Spanish course (being enrolled in a language course is not the same thing as having completed a level of CEFR in the 4 language skills).

Deadline to prove that you have completed level B1

- **15 May / 15 October:** you upload one of the documents explained above with the rest of your application material, before our standard deadline.

If you use [Annex II](#) signed by your home university, they must check (✓) box number 1 or number 2 of the document, confirming you already have reached level B1 or B2.

7. HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR CLASSES

- You may select classes from different study programs in our School and different years of the same study program (UPV degree students do not have this freedom to combine courses).
- Class timetables and exam dates are planned for each study program and for each year of the degree. The more you combine courses from different degrees, the more difficult your timetable could become and you may have overlaps in your classes or with exam dates.
- You must take the majority of your credits from the degree programs offered by your host UPV School (School of Building Engineering – ETSIE), explained in section 6 of this document.



- Maximum 40% of the ECTS you enroll may be selected from other UPV Schools/Faculties, with the limit of 12 ECTS per semester. **However please note that we cannot guarantee enrollment in courses taught in other Schools.**

9. MENTOR STUDENT AND ERASMUS STUDENT NETWORK

Mentor student

This is a local UPV student who is studying in your host UPV School. S/he can help you with academic orientation and can provide practical orientation in the pre-arrival phase and also at the beginning of your stay in Valencia (orientation in the city and on campus, help with finding accommodation, choosing your classes correctly, understanding our academic organization, etc.). 10. SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSES

Intensive Spanish course before the semester (not for free)

We offer a 2-week Spanish course in its campus in Gandia before each semester. Gandia is 70 km south of Valencia and the campus is next to the beach. Students who successfully complete this course will get 4 ECTS and a certificate at the end of the course.

This is a refresher course only. It will not be considered as proof of Spanish language skills. We need proof of your language skills maximum by 15 July or 15 December.

Spanish language course during the semester (free of charge)

UPV offers exchange students the possibility to enroll in a non-intensive Spanish course both in the winter and in the spring semester. These courses have typically 3 hours of class per week.

We offer only A2, B1 B2 and C1 level. **Only students from Asian universities are allowed to enroll in the A1 level.**

Enrollment will open at the beginning of each semester and it will be announced by email. All students will have to take an online placement test (level test) before the beginning of classes. The level obtained will determine the course level you can select at UPV.

If you are staying for two semesters and successfully complete a Spanish course in the first semester, you may apply for the next level in the second semester.

UPV will not require any formal Spanish certificate for admission

However, I have read, understood, and accepted the following points:

- **UPV expects Italian and Portuguese native speakers to enroll in courses (subjects) taught in Spanish, not in English** (preparation of Bachelor or Master's thesis can be carried out in English, as well). Enrollment in any course taught in English will only be exceptionally approved if there are no capacity problems in a certain course (more student requests than spots available).
- Courses (subjects) at UPV have a continuous assessment method, sometimes with exams or assignments due a few weeks after the beginning of the semester. **Italian and Portuguese native speakers are expected to be able to communicate in Spanish since their arrival (not perfect Spanish, but functional). Students must study basic Spanish grammar, pronunciation, and vocabulary before arrival.**
- The Spanish language courses for exchange students during the semester begin at level A2 (B1 in campus Alcoy). **Exchange students will be allowed to participate in these courses as long as they have consolidated the previous CEFR level before arrival** (there is a level exam shortly before the beginning of the classes).

ANNEX II. STATEMENT OF SPANISH LANGUAGE SKILLS (BY HOME UNIVERSITY)

UPV expects partners to check their students' language background. Most of our partner universities require UPV exchange students to prove that they have at least level B1 of CEFR (mostly B2 or even C1) of the language of instruction. We expect the same.

For the sake of quality in exchanges and the performance of your students, we kindly ask partner universities to be serious and realistic about their students' level of Spanish. Keep in mind that language experts generally recommend 120-180 hours of class and several months of practice for the B1-B2 levels of CEFR (between European languages).


